- Regular safeguarding training will be provided to staff.

Parent and Volunteer Involvement

- Parents and volunteers play an important role in safeguarding. We encourage all to be aware of any signs of distress or changes in behaviour in children and to report concerns.
- Information about safeguarding will be viewable online through our website.

Reporting Concerns

- 1 **If You See Something, Say Something:** If you have concerns about a child's safety, report it to the DSL immediately.
- 2 Record Your Observations: Write down what you see or hear, including dates and details.
- 3 Keep It Confidential: Share information only with those involved in safeguarding.

Responding to Allegations

- Stay calm and listen to the child.
- Don't investigate or ask leading questions—just let them talk.
- Report to the DSL as soon as possible.

Code of Conduct

- Treat all students with respect and maintain appropriate boundaries.
- Avoid any form of bullying or discrimination.

Whistleblowing

- Staff should report any concerns about colleagues' behaviour towards students.
- Whistleblowing procedures are in place to support those who speak up.
